Not finding [Jesus], they returned to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers.

And With Your Spirit

Today we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family—Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. This wonderful feast shows how the divine command "be holy because I am holy" (Lev 11:45) is meant for people in ordinary circumstances, not only for those, say, in convents or monasteries. Jesus, Mary, and Joseph lived simple lives. When Jesus was born, Mary and Joseph could sacrifice only "two young pigeons," the offering of the poor (Lk 2:24). Joseph worked as a carpenter, and Mary as a homemaker. Jesus learned carpentry from Joseph and plied his trade until leaving home at the age of thirty

of the poor (Lk 2:24). Joseph worked as a carpenter, and Mary as a homemaker. Jesus learned carpentry from Joseph and plied his trade until leaving home at the age of thirty (Lk 3:23). Mary and Joseph had no theological education and no official status in their religion, yet their preeminent role in salvation history is attested to by the Roman Canon, which places them before every other saint. In Scripture, God chooses Joseph to care for His only Son, and Mary sings, "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, ... all ages will call me blessed" (Lk 1:46, 48). God was able to bless Mary and Joseph because of their attitude, summed up by Mary's response to the angel Gabriel, "Be it done unto me according to your words" (Lk 1:38). God is able to bless us also, when we recognize in the circumstances of daily life our participation in the very work of God: "Believers acting in the various realities of this world contribute to the realization of the divine plan" (Bl. John Paul II, Canonization Homily for St. Josemaria Escriva).



Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord,

Blessings in this Christmas Season. Though the malls think that Christmas goes from Halloween to December 25th, as Christians we know that the twelve days of Christmas last from Christmas through the Feast of the Epiphany. Christ was born on Christmas Day, but his birth was revealed first to his own Jewish people, especially to the poor shepherds. If we look in Matthew's Gospel, we note that the coming of the magi occurred some days later, when the crowds had registered for the census and gone home. The Holy Family was no longer in the stable but in a little house in Bethlehem (Mt. 2:1-12). The magi represent all of the Gentiles who would come to know Jesus not just as the Messiah for the Jews but as the Savior of all of the world. As the Christmas song says, "Come, let us adore him" not just in a crèche under our Christmas tree, but even more in our hearts and lives.

May his light shine ever more brightly in your lives in the new year.

"Waiting"

The question is: Is the humanity of our time still waiting for a Savior? One has the feeling that many consider God as foreign to their own interests. Apparently, they do not need him. They live as though he did not exist and, worse still, as though he were an "obstacle" to remove in order to fulfill themselves. Even among believers—we are sure of it—some let themselves be attracted by enticing dreams and distracted by misleading doctrines that suggest deceptive shortcuts to happiness. Yet, despite its contradictions, worries and tragedies, and perhaps precisely because of them, humanity today seeks a path of renewal, of salvation, it seeks a Savior and awaits, sometimes unconsciously, the coming of the Savior who renews the world and our life, the coming of Christ, the one true Redeemer of and o f the whole o f ---Pope Benedict XVI. General Audience December 20. 2006

"Preparation"

Christmas is a privileged opportunity to meditate on the meaning and value of our existence. The approach of this Solemnity helps us on the one hand to reflect on the drama of history in which people, injured by sin, are perennially in search of happiness and of a fulfilling sense of life and death; and on the other, it urges us to meditate on the merciful kindness of God who came to man to communicate to him directly the Truth that saves, and to enable him to partake in his friendship and his life. Therefore, let us prepare ourselves for Christmas with humility and simplicity, making ourselves ready to receive as a gift the light, joy and peace that shine from this mystery. ---General Audience, December 17, 2008

"Sign"

God's sign is his humility. God's sign is that he makes himself small; he becomes a child; he lets us touch him and he asks for our love. How we would prefer a different sign, an imposing, irresistible sign of God's power and greatness! But his sign summons us to faith and love, and thus it gives us hope: this is what God is like. He has power, he is Goodness itself. He invites us to become like him. Yes indeed, we become like God if we allow ourselves to be shaped by this sign; if we ourselves learn humility and hence true greatness: if we renounce violence and use only the o f truth a n d weapons ---Homily at Mass for the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord, December 24, 2009




