
MEN'S PRAYER BREAKFAST



"AND WITH YOUR SPIRIT"



We have studied virtue from the spiritual viewpoint of Bl. John Ruusbroec, a viewpoint essential for spiritual growth because it describes the goal of the Christian life and inspires us with hope and zeal for attaining it. Accepting the spiritual viewpoint is a

marvelous gift of faith, but one that requires another marvelous gift, perseverance in the task of becoming virtuous. This task is notoriously difficult for us human beings because we are multi-tiered in composition. Note how the world around us comprises four *tiers* of being, physical (chemical compounds), biological (living things), conscious-emotional (animals), and spiritual (humans). Note also that each tier builds on, yet goes decisively beyond, the tier below it. Thus a living thing, while composed of chemical things, is not itself a chemical. It is infinitely more. Remarkably, the human person comprises all four tiers, making our existence unimaginably complicated. Combining the spiritual viewpoint with that of science, we can define virtue as "the impeccable functioning on every level of the human person." To find an example of impeccable functioning, we need look no further than Jesus, the guintessential human person. Consider the occasion when he "looked with anger at the Pharisees" (Mk 3:5). On the spiritual tier, Jesus loved the Pharisees and was inviting them to conversion through his rebuke, knowing however that such compassionate acts would mean his death. Emotionally and physically, Jesus' anger communicated to the Pharisees the degree of their guilt, while mirroring the eternal separation from God toward which their present choices were leading. Fr. KATERI TEKAKWITHA



The daughter of an Algonquin mother and a Mohawk chief was born in 1656. When she was four years old her parents and brother died of smallpox. Kateri survived, but the disease left her scarred and her sight impaired. She was named "Tekakwitha," which means "she who bumps into things." Kate-

ri's uncle took her in, and although she wanted to practice the religion of her mother, her uncle discouraged her. At the age of eighteen, Kateri began studying the Catholic religion in secret. After a time, her uncle gave his permission for her to become a Christian as long as she did not leave the village. There, she put up with ridicule because of her faith. In 1676, Kateri fled to Canada where she made her first Communion on Christmas, 1677. Although the last years of her life were difficult Kateri was known for her kindness and good humor. She died on April 17, 1680 and was canonized by Pope Benedict today, October 21, 2012.
