


VETERANS' MASS AT MQP



"AND WITH YOUR SPIRIT"

Having seen how Jesus, because of his divine virtue, integrated perfectly the multi-tiered being of his human nature, we can now examine how our lesser virtue affects the integration of our being. Our state of virtue is lacking from birth

due to "original sin," and while baptism removes Original Sin itself, it does not remove the consequences. These include ignorance, a weakened will, and the tendency to sin (Catechism, #405). Furthermore, the typical person, on reaching the "age of reason" (about 7 years old), commits personal sins of his own which exacerbate the consequences of Original Sin. Having made these qualifications, we return to Mk 3:5 where Jesus "looked with anger at the Pharisees," but now imagine a person of imperfect virtue, named Ravi, confronting the same Pharisees. On the spiritual tier, Ravi will not be motivated by an unconditional and self-sacrificing love for the Pharisees, but by a love directed toward his personal wellbeing and that of his family and friends. This person may be angry at the Pharisees because he considers God to be his friend and wants to do God a favor by fighting his enemies, or perhaps a family member has faced a similar problem with the Pharisees. On the emotional and physical tiers, Ravi's anger is not his way of communicating to the Pharisees the spiritual dangers they face, but his instinctually motivated way of causing injury, if only public embarrassment, to the Pharisees, who have in some way injured
