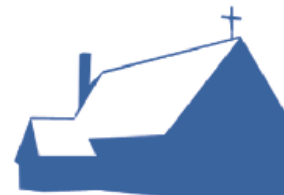

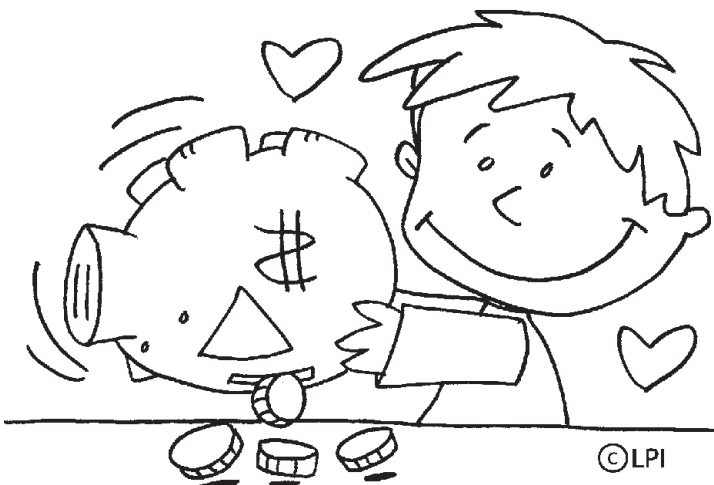
CHILDREN'S CORNER

"AND WITH YOUR SPIRIT"



Thus Jesus Christ, my teacher, calls me to be like him. I make an act of faith in his call, and in his ability to transform me, and begin my search for this "pearl of great price" (Mt 13:46). I start by listening attentively to *all* that Jesus tells me in the Gospels: love as I love (Jn 15:12); forgive from your heart (Mt 18:35); turn the other cheek (Lk 6:28). Attentive listening brings *right thinking*, the knowledge of how I ought to act, the necessary prerequisite to *right action*. Armed with right thinking, I imitate Jesus by putting into practice what he tells me. I may try, for example, to resist arguing my point in some trivial disagreement ("turn the other cheek"), and perhaps I will succeed. This success, however, does not yet make me the *image* of Christ. Beyond imitating Christ, I must acquire his very mind and heart as well. Thus, I can keep from arguing my point, but still continue the conversation in my head for another hour, and perhaps even feel resentful that I was the one with the misfortune to have read the Gospels! Being the image of Christ means being like him on every tier of being (see "And With Your Spirit", Oct 21st). When I am like Christ, (1) I do the right thing, (2) with confidence that this is the will of God, and (3) with an inner joy that I am in the world as God's healing presence.
