### And With Your Spirit

Christmas is near, and all of us hopefully have been enjoying the "Christmas spirit." Many things contribute to the wonderful feeling of this season: decorative lights and inspirational music; Salvation Army bells; the throng of humanity buying gifts for loved ones; and, of course, images of the stable in which the Son of God was born for us. Anticipating Christmas, we feel part of something big. Perhaps, though, a thought passes through our minds that, as the presents disappear from under our trees, so will the Christmas spirit; "normal" life will then return from its hiatus.

Must we lose the Christmas spirit? Our Sunday liturgies help by focusing, not on what we give to one another, but on what God gives to us in Jesus, the baby in a manger. In Jesus, God gives us presents of the heart, presents like humility and tenderness, peace and joy, love and forgiveness. We unwrap these presents by desiring them, by believing that they are indeed meant for me.

Others may lose the Christmas spirit, but we need not. We continue unwrapping our "gifts" by pondering the mysteries of Christ's birth during the entire "Christmas season" (the traditional "twelve days of Christmas"), the liturgical time beginning with Christmas Eve and ending with the Epiphany (January 6<sup>th</sup> this year), the feast of Christ manifesting himself as light of the world. Even beyond Epiphany, we maintain the Christmas spirit by considering how we ourselves, through that spirit, are manifest as light to the world.

### **Quilt Ministry News**

The quilters of our parish, through a Jesuit connection, have sent quilts to some made homeless by Hurricane Sandy. The response is the following:

"Dear Anna:

I wanted to take a moment to thank you and everyone for the extraordinary gift of your quilts.

Last Sunday we held a special Breakfast with Santa event for the children and their parents who have been staying with us. These 61 people from 14 families have been with us since November 5th and have become members of the family. Each morning their yellow school buses come up our driveway and each afternoon they return with these children.

Progress has been slow for them in finding ways to leave us for more permanent homes. Many have had serious damage done to their homes and have not yet been able to make the repairs needed to turn the electric back on. Many face challenges with their insurance companies and their jobs.

So last Sunday we had a chance to prepare a special breakfast and serve them. We brought in a magician and students from Loyola High School in NYC came to play games with them while each family visited Santa, had pictures taken, and collected toys for the children.

It was the moment, however, when we told each family that we had special homemade quilts for them that took the breathe away from the parents and led to rivers of tears and abundant smiles. More than one told me about special memories of their children's quilts lost in the storm. While store-bought gifts are great, nothing says home and future more than a quilt. The care and love that went into each was so evident and so greatly valued.

So, on behalf of those families, let me just say thank you and God bless each of you—those who made them with such care, those who reached out to us, and those who transported them to us. You will be in our thoughts and our prayers throughout this holy season."

Last Friday we had had a party where we played Pictionary with Christmas carols, and had a "who can stuff the most









