A Communion of Disciples

For the next four weeks the liturgical theme at Sts. Mary and Joseph will be "Stewards of God's Grace" (Eph 3:2), a phrase from last week's readings. During Advent and the Christmas season, we pondered the love God revealed in sending His Son to share our human condition. Last week, on the Epiphany, we pondered the glory manifested through Jesus even from his birth. Of this glory we read, "You shall be radiant at what you see; your heart shall throb and overflow" (Is 60:1-6), and we prayed in the *Collect*, "O God, we know you already by faith; bring us to behold the beauty of your sublime glory!" Today, on the feast of the Baptism, God sheds his glory publicly on Jesus by proclaiming from the heavens, "This is my beloved Son!" (Mt 3:17). In weeks to come, as we move through Ordinary Time, we see God's glory manifest in Jesus by miraculous healings, and, maybe even more miraculously, by Jesus' decision to call simple fishermen to manifest his glory in their own lives. The disciples beheld firsthand God's glory, and their hearts did indeed "throb" and overflow." The fullness in their hearts impelled them ultimately to share these blessings with all peoples. We too, as "stewards," pray to "behold" God's glory in our lives, so that our hearts will "throb" until they "overflow" in love and compassion for everyone whom God places in our path. The witness of the disciples invites us to pray in earnest, "O God, let us behold your glory!"

On Monday, January 13, at 6:00pm we will have our orientation for anyone (young and old, even as a family) who would like to join together to experience in a small way what millions of others live daily and to raise money to feed our brothers and sisters who are starving by going without food for 24 hours Feb 1-2 (noon to noon). Last week the Pope blessed a global campaign to pray for end to world hunger. Please watch his brief You Tube message: "Pope Francis' message for One Human Family, Food for All."

How many hours do you think a teen will go without food? Three? Four? Already we have over 15 who have signed up to go without food for 24 hours! May we be challenged by their witness! Through international efforts such as the famine, youth and families have saved THOUSANDS of lives! In 1992, the total number of kids under age 5 who died **each day** was 40,000!—most of them from preventable causes like hunger, poverty, and disease. Think about it, 40,000 children under the age of 5 were dying **EACH AND EVERY DAY!** Through the caring and hard work of youth and their families, that number has fallen from 40,000 to just under 19,000! We **REALLY** can make a difference! Will you join us?
