
Stewards of God's Grace II

St. Paul calls us stewards because we receive from God things of great value that we in turn pass on to others, things like those prophesied last week by Isaiah, "Your heart shall throb and overflow" (Is 60:1-6). Unlike



shall throb and overflow" (Is 60:1-6). Unlike other stewards, perhaps, Christians must strive to obtain what they pass on. Thus St. Ignatius wrote his Spiritual Exercises, and today's psalmist exhorts us to have "ears open to obedience" (Ps 40). We strive with God's unfailing help toward the holiness to which we are called (see 2nd reading, 1 Cor 1:1-3), and this holiness brings with it God's tangible blessings. The process of striving and finding is often referred to as a journey. It is symbolized by the Epiphany story of the three wise men who persevered in their long and perilous journey until they reached the manger to behold the glory of God. They persevered in the *faith* that their sacrifices were nothing compared to the promises to be fulfilled. Faith therefore goes beyond believing the stories of Scripture, to believing that God actually wants and is able!—to fulfill his promises in me personally. With this conviction, I listen eagerly to the readings at mass and apply them to my daily life. St. Ignatius suggests that we begin each day by focusing on a particular dimension of holiness (patience, sensitivity, etc.), and that we keep our intention in the back of our mind throughout the day. This allows God to take us one step further on our remarkable journey.

Sharing the Gospel: Imagine how excited John the



Baptist must have felt after he baptized Jesus. He knew without a doubt that Jesus was God's Son. The very next day John told the crowds that Jesus would take away the sins of the world. God's people had eaten a Passover lamb every year to remember how God saved them from death in Egypt. Jesus was the Lamb of

God. He frees you from your old sins and offers you new life with God.

Prayer: Dear God, thank you for sending Jesus to take away my sins.

Mission for the Week: Read the story about the very first Passover, when God saved the Hebrews from the Angel of Death (Exodus 12).

TUITION SUBSIDY

Use of envelopes provides an accurate record of participation at mass, which is required of those seeking financial subsidy at diocesan parochial schools and Faith Formation programs. Unless the member of the parish is known by the Pastor or the parish staff as a regular attendee at mass, the use of envelopes becomes the principle way for a parish to document mass attendance. If an individual is unknown to the pastoral staff and we are unable to determine whether a person attends mass on a regular basis, it becomes impossible to sign a sponsor/Godparent certificate (which states the person seeking to be a sponsor/ godparent regularly practices the faith) and impossible to approve discounted tuition at diocesan parochial schools. It is also impossible for us to authorize tuition discounts for our Faith Formation program. The use of envelopes (checks or ParishPay) is not about money-it is about mass attendance-it is about accountability and our ability to better serve you. Your understanding and cooperation is deeply appreciated.
