

Reflection 04-10-2016

"Here I am Lord, send me!"

In the musical, Les Miserables, there is a scene where Jean Valjean, an ex-convict, is struggling to stay alive because no one will hire him. As a convict, if he breaks the law again, he will quickly be returned to prison where life is little better than death itself. When he is about to despair and once more steal to survive, he is taken in by a Bishop and given a bed to sleep in and food to eat. Leaving early the next morning, he takes some of the Bishop's silver, thinking it will give him a new start but, alas, he is soon caught and returned to the Bishop's house by the Police. Expecting the worst, he is struck speechless when the Bishop, rather than accusing him, tells the police that the silver was a gift to Jean Valjean and even insists that Jean Valjean also take two silver candlesticks that he had overlooked. When they are alone, the Bishop whispers to Jean Valjean that, by this gift, he has purchased his soul for God and that he must use his life to glorify God by righteous living.

In this Sunday's reading from the Book of Acts, Peter and the other disciples have experienced something similar. Having turned their backs on Jesus when He had needed them most, now they realize that Jesus has made the ultimate sacrifice of His life that their souls might be purchased for God and His Work. Peter has much to dwell on that might cause him to despair of being chosen and loved by God. Jesus, knowing his self-doubt, gives him the chance to profess his love three times and, therefore, removes the self-hatred he carries because of his threefold denial. Is this not true with us as well? Isn't it often our sense of being unworthy that prevents us from standing as disciples of Jesus? Isn't that one of the things that prevents us from standing firm in Christ when the world and our culture derides the way of living to which we are called and have chosen to follow? Jesus' death and resurrection, His saving sacrifice for us, stands as the only evidence we need of God's total and unconditional love for each of us. His gift of the Holy Spirit is the only strength we need to complete His mission. When He calls us to service, our immediate response should be: "Here I am, Lord, send me!"
