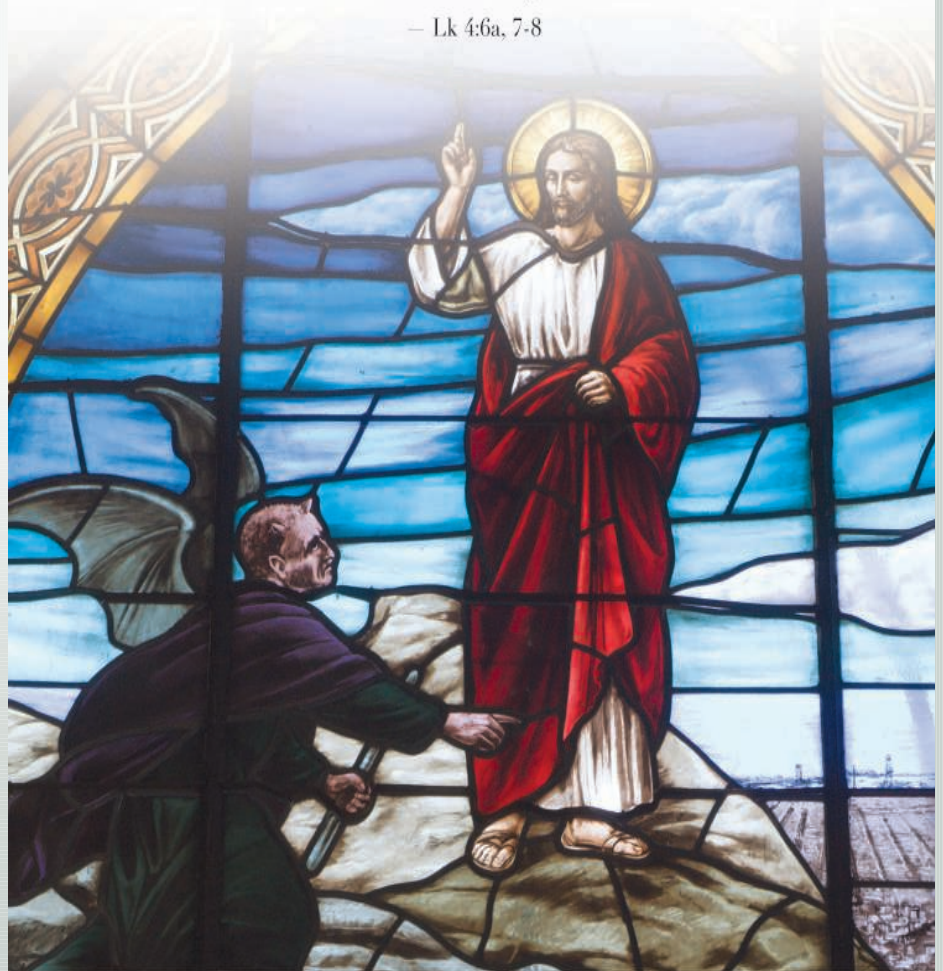

Being Mindful in Lent

As far back as I can remember, the prospect of “observing” the Lenten disciplines and rituals was not high on my list of things to do either as a child or a young adult. “What’s the fun or satisfaction of ‘giving up things’ or taking the time to evaluate my spiritual life?”

Today, thank the Lord, my perspective on Lent has changed. The word that came to me, over and over in the past week, was the word “remind.” Lent is the gift given us by our Church so that we might be **reminded** of what is important in the life we live here on earth. This world has so many distractions that can keep our attention 24/7, 52 weeks out of the year: staying on our schedule for success in our careers; filling our social life with as many stimulating experiences as we can; planning and staying on track with our retirement plans and investments; to mention just three. What a travesty it would be if we looked back after 75 or 80 years and realized that one of these was where we found our deepest identity.

Consider the truths that our discipline of Lent brings to mind!

Fasting from food or abstaining from eating meat: Mindful message: Our bodies are not most important in the eyes of God even if they seem to be in the eyes of others; at our core, we are in essence spiritual beings. Too much material self-indulgence separates or distances us from our Creator; a little physical hunger reminds us of our inner longing for God.

Praying the Way of the Cross or meditating on Jesus’ passion & death: Mindful message: God loves us so much that he made the ultimate sacrifice to convey this truth to us! He saw we were shackled by our sins, our faulty humanity, so he gave His life to break the bond that sin imposed. Now we can live our lives free from the oppression of sin and the evil one.

Confessing our sins: Mindful message: We need to realize how awesome God is and how dependent we are on His grace in order to be the unique person He created us to be! It is in humbling ourselves and admitting sin before God that we are strengthened and renewed in His Grace.

Now is the time for **you** to ponder other gifts of the Lenten season; what is the “mindful message” that they convey to you??

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord Jesus,

Greetings from Charlotte, NC and St. Peter Parish. St. Peter's is a young parish (in the age of parishioners; the parish itself goes back to 1851) in the center of a rapidly growing city. Charlotte has some 750,000 people and the Charlotte Diocese has grown from 37,000 Catholics in 1972 to over 400,000 Catholics today. There is one parish with two churches that has over 30,000 parishioners on their books. The Protestants aren't the only ones who build mega-churches. We do about 36 marriages a year and prepare couples for another 20, who marry back in their hometowns. Because we are in the center of the city, we are the place where people go for a 12:10 Mass and for confessions (M-Sat). On Ash Wednesday, we will have four Masses and a service.

Since Fr. Jim Shea is the pastor, I get to have all the fun. I am involved in both children and adult faith formation and work with the Ignatian Spirituality Team. Like Saints Mary and Joseph, our youth also took part in the Souper Bowl of Caring. However, as you know there was much sadness in Charlotte as the result of the Super Bowl. However, as Pope Francis reminds us, it is more important that we care for the poor. We also shelter 14 homeless men every Monday. The program is called Room at the Inn. Be assured of my continued prayers for all.

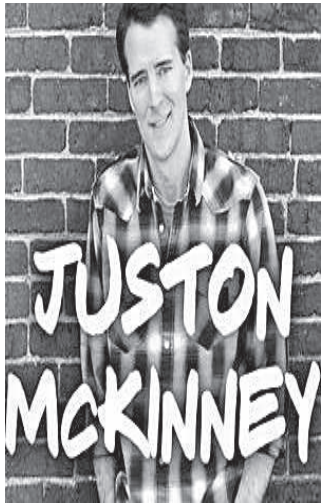

Regulations for Fasting and Abstinence During Lent

FRIDAYS OF LENT are days of abstinence. ABSTINENCE is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed unless work or health is affected. FASTING is to be observed by all 18 to 59 years of age. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals can be eaten, sufficient to maintain strength, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.
