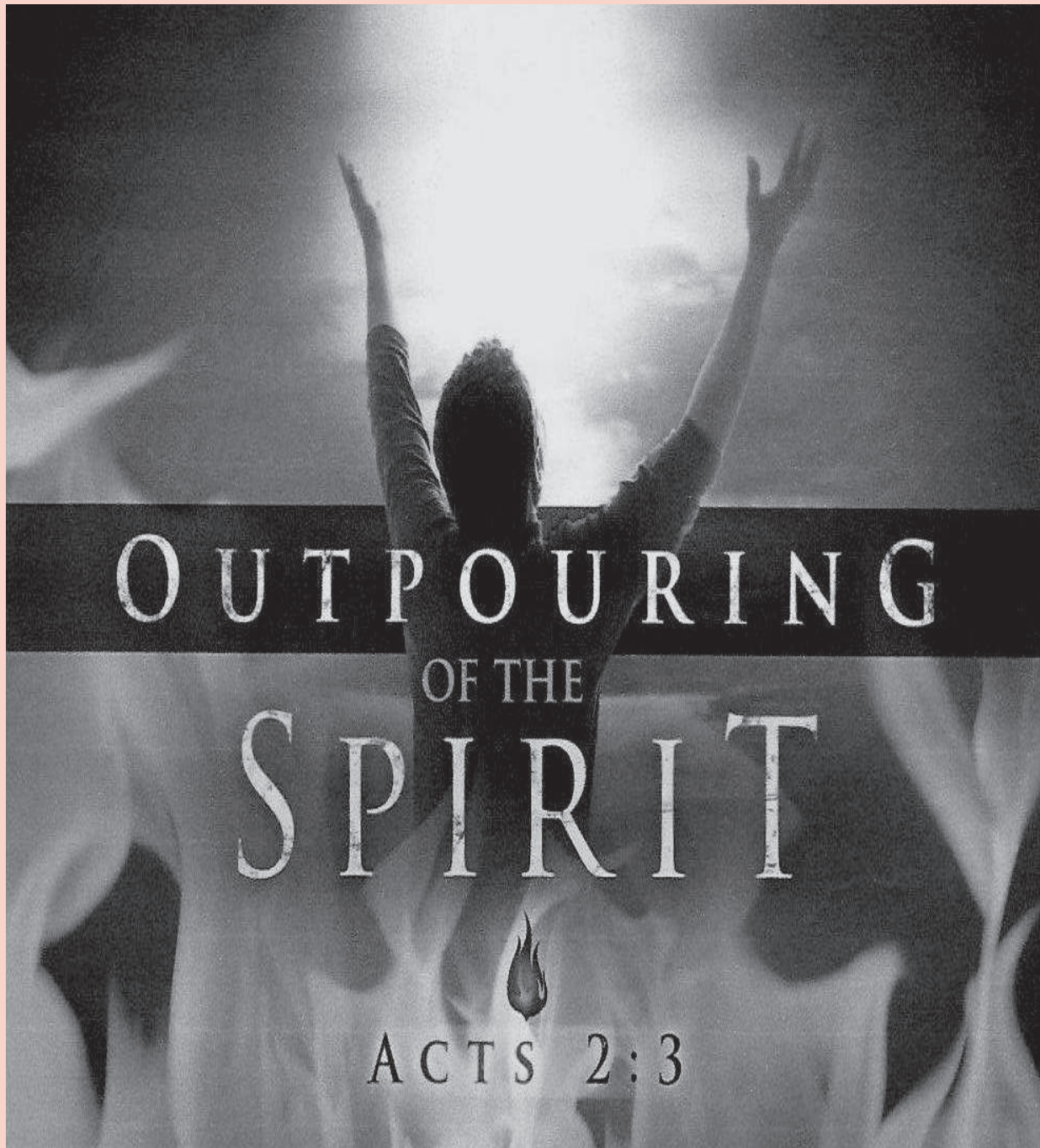

The old order changeth, yielding place to new, and God fulfills himself in many ways. Alfred Lord Tennyson.

God is always with us, because he loves us and proved his faithfulness in Jesus. We are not always so good at being faithful to him. As the culture changes and becomes more secular, it is even harder for many to ignore the siren calls of materialism and popular culture and keep faith, living in the love of God and neighbor and worshipping at the Eucharistic table.

For some years the Pastoral Council, the parish staff and the Finance Council have been worried about and praying about the declining number of parishioners who come to Mass regularly and support their parish. Even at Christmas and Easter we see only about 40% of those who are on the parish books. Yet it is common for people to have their children baptized and then come back seven years later to prepare for First Communion.

Salem is also an aging community. In 1996 and 1997, Mary Queen of Peace and St. Joseph celebrated 194 and 178 baptisms, respectively. In 2012 and 2013, Saints Mary and Joseph Parish celebrated 87 and 84 baptisms, respectively. In those years, we celebrated 104 and 112 funerals. New families will be coming in to replace those who have died or who have gone to assisted living or nursing homes.

How can we attract young families? How can we bring back those young families who have migrated to a couple of evangelical churches for the liveliness of the music and preaching? Clearly the Mass with the most young families is the 11 AM Folk Mass at St. Joseph. The children's Liturgy of the Word attracts 20 to 30 children each week. The music also attracts the children. After prayer and much discussion with the Councils and staff, I have decided to offer a second contemporary music Mass at Mary Queen of Peace. It will be offered at 9:30 AM beginning in the Fall. Thus the 9 AM Mass will drop out and the 10:45 will move to 11 AM. Since the 8:45 AM at St. Joseph draws only about 85 worshippers, we will be phasing out that Mass, and asking those parishioners to go to Mary Queen of Peace for the 9:30 or to the 7:30 at St. Joseph. We will also begin offering Sunday evening Masses twice a month, corresponding to some of our Middle School and High School religious education meetings.

Change is not easy. But consider the changes that you have made in your life to accommodate your children as they have advanced in school. Are you willing to do as much to worship God in your parish and attract young families to revive the parish? I invite you to pray about this. Please don't listen to the gut reaction which says, "Why are those fools doing this to me?" Instead, ask God to give you peace in the face of this change, and ask God to bless our efforts to bring the parish to becoming that place where young families discover the love of Christ and grow as a people of love and worship.

Prayer Shawl Testimonial

I would like to share with you a story about two people who received prayer shawls, and their testimonies.

A few weeks ago one of our parishioners gave her mother-in-law, who was very ill, a shawl. She said every time she put the prayer shawl on she felt the presence of God and was not alone. Having the shawl made a lot of difference in her recovery.

The second person had to have a serious surgery in Boston and was given a prayer shawl from our church. Her family said she had it on all the time. One day while she was healing in the hospital the doctor came in to check on her. He asked, "What is that around your shoulders?" She told him it was a prayer shawl and why she keeps it on. He said, "We can cure and heal patients, but I realize at times it's not us but someone more powerful, especially when it's out of our hands to cure someone and they are cured."

Is Your Catholic Faith Showing?

Garson Kanin (in *The Atlantic*, March, 1964) recounts some of his visits to Felix Frankfurter, the famous justice of the Supreme Court. One day Frankfurter said:

I have had a serious experience here....You saw that nurse who went out a while ago? The tall, pretty, blond one? Audree? We've been spending many hours here together, and I've had an opportunity to find out a great deal about her life. She is a devout Catholic. Look here. I have spent a good deal of energy attempting to avoid prejudice. But the dogma of the Catholic Church, or of any other denomination for that matter, has always put me off. Now this girl, this Audree—I have never known generosity of such quality, or such rare kindness. Oh yes, far, far beyond duty. Overwhelming courtesy. And I have been asking questions, delving into the matter, trying to discover the well-spring of such superior behavior. Do you know what it turns out to be? Can you guess? Simply this: a practical application of her Catholicism. I've never known anyone who practiced a religion, whose everyday life is based upon religion as much as this girl's is.

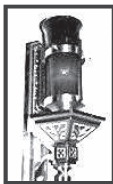

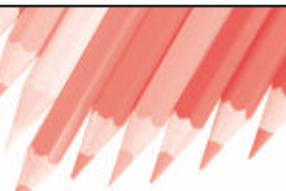
