And so our parish embraces more fully the family approach to Faith Formation... church and family partnering together to learn, grow, and serve together so as to make disciples to further establish God's Kingdom. Families with youth in grades 1-8 come together monthly to engage in a faith formation experience designed for families: typically beginning with a focusing activity on the monthly topic, then breaking into age-level small groups and then coming back together in a large group to tie and all together and to receive a "sending-forth" activity to practice living the class lesson as a family. Each session either begins or end with a parish Mass. High School classes are offered at the same time as the Family Program. So no more bringing one child on one day and another child on another day... the whole family comes at the same time!

Notice day after day God helping you to love more like Jesus!!



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


# **Growing in Discipleship Together**

#### **Baptismal Certificate:**

By EASTER, ALL Candidates need to turn in a copy of their baptismal certificate... unless you were baptized here.

Please inform us if you were baptized here.

#### **Sponsor**

#### A sponsor is someone who:

- Celebrates the Eucharist regularly
- Is at least 16 years of age and is a confirmed practicing Catholic
- Is not a parent of the candidate being sponsored
- Models for you what an authentic faithful Catholic Christian is
- Is willing to support and encourage you on your faith journey
- If married, must be in a valid marriage
- Returns sponsor form signed by their pastor
- Forms /given out at Jan mtg/ due by EASTER

#### **Confirmation Name**

In Scripture we have examples of people's names being changed when they were given a new role or when they experienced a conversion. Abram and Sarai's names changed to Abraham and Sarah when they become believers in the One God. When Jesus appointed him the leader of the apostles, Simon's name changed to Peter. Saul, who persecuted the first Christians, changed his name to Paul when he became an apostle. Because Confirmation celebrates your being fully-initiated into the Church, and it could be a significant faith-life moment where you sincerely commit to growing and being a disciple of Jesus, choosing a Confirmation name reflects this intention. You may choose the name you were baptized with, therefore confirming what was celebrated when you were baptized. Or you may choose the name of a saint who represents for you what a Christian should be, therefore reminding you of your commitment to live as a disciple.

If choosing a name, inform Sue by EASTER.

The Diocese of Manchester developed a Pastoral Plan for Catechesis entitled: Feed My Sheep: Nourishing Disciples.

The document states that parish programs are to reflect lifelong faith formation inspired by the baptismal catechumenate (I.e. RCIA), and the programming for youth ought to follow a comprehensive youth ministry model, active participation of the parish community, and incorporate a spirit of evangelization. In regarding Confirmation specifically, the document states:

Confirmation catechesis teaches that Confirmation increases and deepens the grace of Baptism. It is important that preparation emphasizes and strengthens the "baptismal conferral of the Holy Spirit" (NDC, p 123) and prepares candidates to witness to their faith in their words and deeds.

In addition to preparation in a comprehensive youth ministry program ... the Diocese recommends that iParents and sponsors should be actively Involved in the catechetical preparation as well as be provided resources to help them understand and fulfill their role.

Spiritual experiences and service opportunities are an integral part of vibrant parish communities... These experiences and opportunities include prior catechesis to prepare the candidates and other parishioners and a reflection afterward to understand what was experienced and to explore what effect it had on them personally and as a group.

#### **An Overview**

#### Jesus left us a mission: Go and make disciples!

What is a disciple? A disciple is someone who seeks to orient his/her whole life around Jesus. A disciple wants to know what Jesus knows, wants to speak as Jesus speaks, wants to do what Jesus does. A disciple is to be totally devoted to being like Jesus.

As a parish staff, we are here to partner with families in nurturing each other's faith development as we grow in discipleship. We recognize that parents are the primary educators in the faith of their children... The family is the greatest influence on the behavior, beliefs and practices of children.

We are here to support, encourage and guide each other in becoming authentic disciples as we serve the three goals described in the National Conference of Catholic Bishops' document:

#### Renewing the Vision:

- To empower young people to live as disciples of Jesus Christ in our world today
- To draw young people to responsible participation in the life, mission and work of the Catholic faith community
- To foster the total personal and spiritual growth of each young person

We seek to be faithful to God's Call while considering the needs of our youth and their families. Through a consistent evaluation, in collaboration with the challenge of Pope Francis and the bishops, Faith Formation for grades 1-8 embraces a family approach... we hope that it will be more family-friendly since children come at the same time, rather than 2-3 separate times.

High School sessions are also offered at the same time to help with family scheduling.



Preparation for Confirmation

Teens are free to respond to God's call to live their faith more deeply: to worship, to witness, to serve and to continue to grow in faith as a confirmed Christian. We challenge youth and their families to not "go through the motions", but to approach Confirmation with sincerity and integrity... one does not need to be confirmed to be married in the Church (though if people want to be married in the Church, they are saying they want God to be a part of their marriage, so doesn't it then make sense to confirm your faith?) If one doesn't intend to celebrate Mass on a regular basis, is she/he meaning the "YES" at Confirmation to live as God calls us to live? The challenge is to say what we mean and mean what we say. Confirmation is available at any time from this point on... it doesn't have to happen this year or next. Ideally it ought to be celebrated when YOU mean it. Faith is a journey... each person is at a different place...



If seeking to confirm their faith, teens who have completed the Emmaus Experience are asked to write a letter of intent to the pastor and parish describing their desire and readiness to say YES:

The following are the guidelines in writing the letter...

#### Please use a blue or black pen if not typing... THANKS!

BE TRUTHFUL: do not tell us what you think we want to hear! Greeting:

Dear Fr. Tom and Parishioners of Ss Mary & Joseph Parish,

- 1. Paragraph 1: introduce yourself, describe your background.
- 2. Paragraph 2: Request the Sacrament of Confirmation, explaining why you want to be confirmed.
- 3. Paragraph 3: Describe how the parish/people in the parish, classes, service experiences, youth ministry activities has helped you in understanding what it means to be a Catholic Christian.
- 4. Paragraph 4: Tell how you plan to live out your Confirmation.
- 5. Conclude the letter and sign

Faith Formation for Grades 1-8 takes a family approach.
Family sessions (described more on the next page) are held monthly, either

- Beginning with the 9:30 Mass at MQP,
- Concluding with the 11am Mass at St Joe's or
- Beginning with the 5pm Mass at St Joe's.

First and second graders who don't have older siblings, may opt for the Children's Liturgy of the Word at the 9:30 Mass at MQP or the 11am Mass at St Joe's. Just before the readings begin, children are dismissed where they will hear and discuss the readings on a child's level. Children return to their parents at the time of the preparation of the gifts.



# First Reconciliation and First Eucharist



To insure there is a foundation on which to build, families wanting their children prepared for these sacraments need to participate in one of the Faith Formation options one year prior to preparation During the sacramental year, families will participate in the Faith Formation Option of their choosing, as well as monthly sacramental preparation.

First Reconciliation: Parent Meeting October 30th or 31st Youth and Parent Meetings: Nov 20/21 and Dec 11/12 Celebrate in January

First Communion: Parent Meeting January 29th or 30th Youth and Parent Meetings in Feb 19/20 and Mar 26/27 Celebrate in May



### **FAMILY FAITH FORMATION**

The Family Program serves families with children in Grades 1-8. The monthly sessions include Mass, the faith formation experience, and a home activity. **This is not a drop off program ...**Youth attend **with** their parents or guardians. A typical schedule has families meeting in a large group setting, then breaking off into age=-level groups, then culminating as a large group.

So much learning of the Faith happens outside the 'classroom' setting and happens in the actual doing. Because Faith Formation is meant to effect and affect the way we live, 'homework' offers us the opportunity to practice what is learned in the monthly classes.

We also seek to grow as a community so as to be better equipped to serve others in the Salem area.

#### Families are also encouraged to participate in:

- At least 1 other parish activity besides weekly Mass
- A retreat: Several options will be available
- Parish-wide DAY of SERVICE: we come together as families to serve within the community ... Mass and lunch are provided. Choose at least one:

October 22nd, April 22nd and/or May 20th

#### Option 3: Teen Encounter Retreat Weekend

Teen Encounter is a Catholic Christian experience based on what it means to be Christian, especially a teenage Catholic Christian living in a world that is often in darkness and ignorant of Jesus, the true light of the world. It is a dynamic living experience with a variety of Christian learning activities in sharings, teachings, discussion, songs, games, prayer, and Sacraments. Teen Encounter is YOUTH ministering to YOUTH. Many talks are given by teenagers themselves on everyday Christianity in the home, community, parish, and the world. This weekend at St Basil's in Methuen replaces the 5 classes above and the Discipleship Workshop Day below.

The Emmaus Experience

In an attempt to simplify the illustration of the overall process, we've come up with an acronym... no matter our age or where we go to school or what we do for work or who our

friends are, each of us is invited to experience and grow to a deeper understanding of what true discipleship is... let it first be understood that growing in this understanding takes a LIFE TIME! But by participating in each 'letter', a more complete foundation of what one's "YES" in

Confirmation implies is started. The Emmaus Experience year begins a focused look on discipleship while the Preparation Year develops one's understanding of the Sacrament and all that the Rite celebrates.

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#### Curriculum

#### Family Faith Formation follows a 4 year rotating curriculum:

**God the Father:** the unfolding story of our relationship with God as experienced by our ancestors in Faith.

**God the Son:** coming to know Jesus through the Gospels & the Sacraments.

**God the Holy Spirit:** discovering the Third Person of the Trinity and recognizing the Spirit in the early Church and today.

Morality and Catholic Social Teaching: considering our call to be in a right relationship with God and each other first made known through the 10 Commandments, then

dis-covering the deeper implications through Jesus' teachings, the Beatitudes, Acts of Mercy and Catholic Social Teaching.



The **High School Emmaus Experience** will focus on considering what it really means to be a disciple as they discern their readiness to embrace the sacrament of Confirmation at this time.

The **Preparation for Confirmation**, in keeping with diocesan guidelines, will cover the Holy Spirit, gifts and fruits of the Spirit, history and theology of the Sacrament, the meanings of the ritual actions, and one's personal readiness, call and response.

Our parish has grade-level **Youth Groups** to offer support, encouragement, prayer and guidance in living our Faith in the everydayness of our lives.. Weekly meetings involve discussing/experiencing our faith with peers, developing new friendships, offering acceptance, respect, love and laughter and being challenged to live out on how to be a disciple of Christ.

Your children are invited to drop in on any of our gatherings.

Their friends are welcome too!

# **HIGH SCHOOL MINISTRY**

Though it may be a common presumption, the goal of high school ministry is NOT Confirmation. We seek to offer a high school ministry, **focused on making disciples**... Confirmation is offered for those who are ready to say and mean their "YES".

Confirmation is not a graduation from Faith Formation, but rather one choosing to say 'YES' to WANTING God to be more in your life, YOU WANT to live your life in keeping with the Way of Jesus, YOU WANT to continue growing and learning, and YOU WANT to join in the Church's mission to continue Jesus' ministry to establish the Kingdom of God.

Not everyone is ready to say "YES" during their high school years... every year there are countless adults who celebrate Confirmation. It's okay to wait until one is able to say what they mean and mean what they say.

This is not suggesting one should not send his/her teen to high school Faith Formation activities... these are all meant to provide experiences for them to get to God, to be Church, to discern where they are now in their faith journey and where they need to grow personally, and be better equipped to either say "YES!" or "Not yet"... It's not a 'waste of time' if, after experiencing



high school faith formation, to then choose to wait to confirm one's faith... it means he/she is a person of integrity and wants the sacrament to mean something... it means he/she isn't just going through the motions.
