

HOLY TRINITY




FATHER SON SPIRIT

The Trinity:

What's the point of three persons being One God? What does God being Trinity have to teach us?

One purpose is **UNITY!**

The Trinity Illustrates for us what unity is all about and invites us to unite.



Jesus tells us that He and the Father are one (John 10:30).... and that when we see Him, we see the Father. (John 14:9)

Jesus is all about expressing who the Father is and doing what the Father wants. **Unity means putting aside his wants for the sake of the Father's Will.** Such unity requires Trust, Sacrifice and Love... This unity is so powerful that it cannot be self-contained and so we have the Spirit, that life-giving and transformative force of their Union.
